The geography curriculum at Shute inspires children to develop a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people. The curriculum develops an understanding of global geographical issues. This knowledge supports our students to consider their responsibility to other people, the environment and the sustainability of the planet.

Shute pupils will become independent learners with the ability to question, investigate and think critically about what they observe and the issues affecting our changing world. In every year group the curriculum is mapped into topics with learning objectives covering the four areas of the curriculum (location knowledge, place knowledge, human and physical geography, geographical skills and fieldwork).

At Shute school our school has lots of outdoor space, is neighboured by woodland and located in an area of outstanding natural beauty. This provides excellent opportunities for fieldwork at a local level. We are located just a few miles from the Jurassic coast and Seaton wetlands, providing real-life case studies and educational trips linked to topic work.

At Shute we recognise that Geography is an ever changing subject and the curriculum is reviewed annually to reflect the latest geographical thinking.
